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Abdominal Xray Showing Extensive Bilobar Pneumobilia with Clear Delineation of Biliary Radicles

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Clinical image description

A 58 years male patient presented with history of colicky right abdominal pain since 3 months, along with history of intermittent jaundice. On examination patient was hemodynamically stable, per abdomen was soft non – tender and no distension. Per rectal was normal. Laboratory findings showed evelated ALP-189 (42-128 U/L), previous bilirubin was 4.7 but on presentation it was normal. Initial abdominal x-rays studies showed extensive bilobar pneumobilia with clear delineation of biliary radicles and distension of small bowel and large bowel with no air fluid levels. Patient was further evaluated with USG and CECT abdomen and planned for surgical intervention.
